#### 11.a Public Hearing - Public Input Regarding Trustee Area Map Scenarios #1 and #2

At 7:15 p.m., a Public Hearing was held regarding Trustee Area Scenarios #1 and #2. No public comments were given.

Superintendent Dr. Roger Rice took a moment to recognize our VUSD School Board Members in honor of National School Board Recognition Month. Cabinet Members took a moment to express their appreciation to the Board Members.

#### 15.a Consideration for Approval to Move Forward with a General Obligation Bond in 2022

Dr. Rebecca Chandler, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, and Mr. Jon Isom, Financial Advisor, gave a brief update on the possibility of adding a General Obligation (GO) Bond to the ballot in 2022. Timelines for adding a GO bond to the June ballot verses the November ballot were discussed. It was noted that the average number of bonds in Ventura County is three; Ventura currently has one, passed in 1997. It was also noted that the original estimation was to seek a 350 million dollar bond, however that amount has now increased and could now be upwards of 380 million.

#### 17.b Legal Update: The New Classified Layoff Process (AB438)

Ms. Andrea Crouch, Director of Classified Human Resources, gave an update on Assembly Bill (AB) 438 which was signed on October 8, 2021 and became effective on January 1, 2022. AB 438 changes Education Code and Government Code relating to the layoff of classified employees. A preliminary notice of layoff must now be given by March 15 and final layoff notices must be sent to the employee before May 15. Employees now have the right to a hearing to challenge their layoff and retain reemployment rights for 39 months.

#### Dear Board,

In my 27 years in Ventura Unified School District, I have said, "We need a full-time counselor at our elementary schools!" Every year since we have had LCAP surveys, that has been the one suggestion I always write in. This year, 2021-2022, has been the first year that a school I have worked in has had a full-time counselor. This has been WONDERFUL!

The elementary site is definitely different than the middle or high school, but we do need counselors in the elementary schools. In the elementary site, we have the opportunity to do early intervention. Think about anything in life whether it's your plumbing, your car, your health, etc. Is it better to neglect a problem or deal with it when it's smaller? We all know the answer! Early intervention is key and our counselor is vital to the success of our students. Counselors in the elementary school have the opportunity to build bridges with families for six years! Elementary counselors that are at two or more sites are not able to bond as easily with families and they have too many students to effectively work with.

Counselors at the elementary site are dealing with social-emotional and family life issues only. They do not have the responsibility of scheduling academic courses or guiding students in college decisions. However, what they can do in the early years can help ward off the discipline and social issues that do happen in the later years by dealing with them before they snowball.

Our counselor, Mrs. Mary Anderson, is a fabulous counselor. She is not only taking small groups of kids to work on issues from abandonment to friendship skills, but she also is in the classroom teaching whole group skill lessons. Together we are teaching our youngest students about the skills from Second Step and about concepts such as the power of being an ally, not a bully. In the past, I have had other terrific counselors like Sheila Holland who stretched herself working at two schools. I am sure the staff at Portola would be able to attest to the difference having a counselor full-time makes.

Please don't stop investing in the mental health of our elementary school students. This needs to be a priority and needs to be ongoing. Elementary sites are the place to invest in skills that will help not only currently, but in the future.

Thank you for taking these thoughts into consideration and thank you a full-time counselor this year! It is truly making a difference in the lives of many students and staff.
